





BeConWiz Creating Thinkers CHAT PACK

Chat packs are designed to be a pressure free opportunity for your child(ren) to develop speaking, listening and recording skills while sharing their current ideas and knowledge of a given topic. It is a great opportunity for peers, parents and teachers to bear witness to what can happen when creative and critical thinking can evolve as students initiate conversations in styles and groupings of their choice. *The chat packs were inspired and have been adapted from Tony Ryan's Thinkers keys.*

An example of two children using their primary language to record ideas during chat pack time. These words where then later used in an ELS class as a translation inquiry. The students' primary language and prior knowledge were valued and uncovered a rich knowledge that could be shared in the class inquiry.




Invite your child(ren) to choose one card to focus on. As your child(ren) discuss ideas connected to the card, they should also be experimenting with different recording strategies.

- O Make sure lots of recording tools and graphic organisers are easily accessible for your child(ren) to record ideas.
- O While your child(ren) are discussing ideas, you can use this opportunity to gather and record topic specific terminology/vocabulary being shared by your child(ren). This can then be used to enrich word study or spelling tasks. In doing this you are making visible to your child(ren) that they values the prior knowledge and ideas being bought forward.
- O New, interesting and important vocabulary and ideas can be explored and developed using word web resources.

Use the prompt and explanation pages to create your own cards relevant to your child's age and area of study.



Symbol for the task focus


Symbol for creative thinking

Crossing boundaries			How can you use what you know in a new way? Learn to apply ideas and approaches from one domain into a seemingly unrelated context.

Formula			FORMULA Create a recipe or formula showing what is needed to create an object, event or thing
Free Thought			Use a stimulus to encourage your senses to explore and generate ideas (draw, write, build, etc) related to this experience.
Generate Imagine			Engage thinkers to both generate and explore ideas at the same time . Thinkers develop, imagine and evolve mental representations, then use them to develop something physical.
Invent			What could you make, design or invent to solve a particular problem?
Make it work			Use a set of unusual ideas or objects to solve a problem or address an issue.
Pose the problem			Think backwards -look at a possible scenario and instead of asking questions to which there is a correct answer, create a problem that might have created the answer.

Predict			Think about the effects or perspectives that the future may hold about the past or will predict what the future might look like.
Problem & possibilities			List the good and bad points: Take binary positions about an idea
Random			Choose something random and find a way to connect to a given topic. Think about how this thinking might be used to solve a problem.
Reverse			Think in the opposite direction of a proposed position; propose the things that couldn't ever happen
Provoke			Identify an issue or position and all the ideas that suggest it is problematic or fantastic; use this to provoke and explore the deeper issues, problems or possibilities
Support the strange			Strive for the unusual and explore strange options. Use fantasy thinking. What is the strangest possibility that could be connected to a problem or situation?
Upside down			Take ordinary objects or experiences and creatively reimagine how they function or connect to other things. Thinkers need to turn ideas upside down.
What if			Generate ideas and make visible new possibilities or propose/ engage with potential actions

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"BCW will now use 'they - themself' as a singular, gender-neutral pronoun in all material and resources generated. Just as the use of 'he - man' disappeared women's voice and identity, use of the binary 'she - he' and related pronouns has disappeared and rendered voiceless marginalised groups that do not identify with the 'he -she' pronouns. Until some wider grammatical agreement has been reached about what pronouns will be used to embrace the diversity of gender experience, in text we will use 'they - themself' in our materials. Given that words/language create reality, using language that is acknowledging and inclusive of

all people who identify across a wide gender spectrum is an issue of power, politics, respect and visibility. "
